Science and Sustainability Award



Özgür Atalay University of Manchester

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Özgür Atalay is one of the leading experts in smart textiles, renowned for his pioneering work in textile-based wearable electronics and soft robotics. He has received numerous awards, including the prestigious ERC Grant, for his ground breaking innovations, such as a knitted robotic glove designed for individuals with disabilities. At Istanbul Technical University, he co-founded a cutting-edge laboratory dedicated to soft robotics and wearable technology. Dr. Atalay also leads several major EU-funded projects, fostering collaborations with esteemed partners across Europe.

Özgür Atalay gained significant experience working in an interdisciplinary environment focused on sensor integration in textiles. The university's collaborative and international atmosphere expanded his research perspective. This experience allowed him to enhance his technical skills and strengthened his passion for innovation in wearable electronics.

Özgür Atalay is committed to advancing fundamental science in both his home country and across Europe, with the aim of improving people's lives.



Sema Dumanlı Oktar University of Bristol

Sema Dumanlı is the founder of Boğaziçi University's Antennas and Propagation Laboratory. She invented in-body wireless monitoring at the molecular level through genetically modified cells, a technology with the potential to revolutionize healthcare by enabling real-time detection of viruses and bacteria. This globally patented innovation was featured on the cover of IEEE Antennas and Propagation Magazine and showcased in numerous international conference talks.

The UK's unique academic environment encouraged Sema to pursue ambitious research goals while addressing societal needs. Her experiences at the University of Bristol shaped her commitment to equitable healthcare, diversity, and inclusion.

Sema now inspires Turkey's youth to pursue engineering, advancing research on critical global challenges like antimicrobial resistance and HIV.







Ozan Bahcivan University of the West of England, Bristol University of Central Lancashire

Dr. Ozan is a clinical and health psychologist specializing in psycho-on-cology. He is the founding president of the Turkish Psycho-Oncological Association (Psiko-Onkologlar Derneği) and serves as the European Director for the International Psycho-Oncology Society (IPOS). Additionally, he is the founding head of the Health Psychology Division of the Turkish Psychological Association (Türk Psikologlar Derneği). Dr. Ozan is dedicated to improving the mental well-being of cancer patients, advancing professional standards, and raising awareness through initiatives such as World Psycho-Oncology Day. His leadership has made a significant impact on both the medical and psychological communities in Turkey and beyond.

Dr Ozan gained hands-on experience through supervised psychology work placements, allowing him to apply his learning in real-world settings.

Dr. Ozan Bahcivan aims to further advance psycho-oncology in Europe, strengthen international collaborations, and support the integration of mental health care in cancer treatment.

Merve Yıldırım University of Sussex

Dr. Merve Yıldırım is an assistant professor in computer engineering, with seven years of academic experience. She holds both a MSc in Advanced Computer Engineering and a PhD in Informatics from the University of Sussex. Her research focuses on information security and computer networks, incorporating multidisciplinary perspectives such as human-computer interaction, psychology, and user behavior. Dr. Yıldırım has successfully mentored students in international competitions, achieving significant recognition in the field. In 2024, she was honored as an Outstanding Instructor.

Dr. Yıldırım credits her education at the University of Sussex for enhancing her leadership, critical thinking, and collaboration skills

Hande Soğancılar University of Manchester

Hande Soğancılar, an expert in economic empowerment and poverty reduction with more than 12 years of experience in civil society. She has supported 10,000+ refugees and 400 women entrepreneurs and cooperatives through livelihood programmes and entrepreneurship support. During the Kahramanmaraş Earthquake, she helped young women gain employability and launched Türkiye's first online B2B social procurement platform for rebuilding their lives.

Studying at the University of Manchester shaped Hande Soğancılar's approach to human rights through development studies, activism, exposure to UK's strong civil society and global perspectives.

Hande Sogancilar hopes to bring together all the expertise she gathered during her professional experiences to advocate for enhancing economic situation of disadvantaged women and combatting poverty of vulnerable populations by influencing social policies around the issues she tries to tackle through her publications and program leadership.







Prof. Dr. Barış Alpaslan University of Manchester

Dr. Baris Alpaslan is a Professor of Economics at the Department of Economics, Social Sciences University of Ankara. In addition to his professorial duties, Prof. Alpaslan holds several administrative positions at different levels within the same university. He is also affiliated with multiple renowned research centres in the UK, Australia, and Japan. Prof. Alpaslan earned his MSc (with distinction) and subsequently a PhD in Economics from the University of Manchester. His research interests primarily focus on the macroeconomics of growth, inequality, and development.

He currently serves as a Vice President of the Committee of Experts on the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development Goals at the Turkish National Commission for UNESCO. His contributions to research have been acknowledged with numerous prestigious research and incentive awards. Currently a presenter at TRT World, Elif is known for her critical approach to storytelling, uncovering cultural narratives globally. She founded and served as editor-in-chief of SabitFikir, a contemporary literature magazine focused on accessible cultural criticism.

Beyond journalism, she has hosted international events on humanitarian issues, technology, culture, and tourism, collaborating with organizations like the UN, Web Summit, and British Council.

Special Award for Humanitarian Relief



Kadriye İpek Miscioğlu London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE)

K. İpek Miscioğlu worked at UNHCR Türkiye Operation for seven years, serving in two emergency situations including the Earthquake Situation. Her work was instrumental in facilitating thousands of refugees' access to services and protection of persons with vulnerabilities, such as unaccompanied and separated children and people at risk of and survivors of violence, both in urban areas and the earthquake zone, particularly the most affected provinces Hatay, Malatya, Adıyaman, and Kahramanmaraş.

ipek observes that LSE provided her with qualities to identify needs and means to meet needs in human rights area in general and migration in particular. Academic excellence on global and Türkiye-specific human rights and migration law and mechanisms, critical analysis, and awareness on complex nature of global migration were key in this regard. İpek is now taking her skills and expertise to policy development in Türkiye, focusing on migration and border management.
